Stop Cuckstye Action Group Update

Cuckfield Parish Council continues to liaise with and support the recently formed Stop Cuckstye Action Group (SCAG). As well as contributing to the over-attended and very successful Question Time, it is providing funding for the first professional technical evidence report, looking into the significant landscape impacts from the proposed 1,600 houses.

Despite Jonathan Ash-Edwards (leader of MSDC) and Mims Davies MP assertions on record that they are seeking to remove the location from the site allocations, we are aware that MSDC officers are currently continuing with the plan as published in draft earlier in the year. The developer, Fairfax, is also continuing with their planning, designing and environmental surveying.

We await to see what the on-going political chaos will bring to the Levelling Up Bill, published just before the Prime Minister's ministerial evacuation and demise, and whether this will have any impact on the excessively increased housing targets. In the meantime though, District Plan timings mean SCAG needs to continue preparing its own robust evidence base to demonstrate why this development is completely unsustainable.
